

Five Brose plants receive Jaguar Land Rover Award

Jaguar Land Rover has presented Brose's production plants in Coventry (UK), Ostrava (Czech Republic), Tondela (Portugal), Wuppertal and Würzburg (Germany) with the "JLRQ Award". The British car manufacturer awards this prize to suppliers who meet the high requirements in terms of quality, customer satisfaction and continuous improvement.

The plants in Ostrava and Wuppertal produce closure systems for the British carmaker, Tondela supplies drives for liftgates and trunk lids, and Würzburg produces cooling fan modules.
